We refuse to Accept the Unacceptable in our society, and for us, Youth Homelessness is unacceptable, so we're kicking back against the idea that any young person is too "at-risk" to Love and doing what we can to prevent and end youth homelessness.

We believe that though the maunga (mountain) of ending youth homelessness may be huge, it is possible to climb. And that when we come together as a community, have the courage to dream with our eye's open, we can move mountains.

People Against Prisons Aotearoa

People Against Prisons Aotearoa is New Zealand's largest prison abolitionist organisation. We believe in ending prisons and building a better world.

Ten years ago, three queer people protested cops' and prison guards' presence in the 2015 Auckland Pride Parade. Security broke one of our members' arms and police handcuffed her afterwards. We learned then that the state only tolerates queer existence when we're grateful for the crumbs they give us. When we come together to demand better, they throw us in prisons to shut us up.

That action changed the shape of Pride in Tāmaki. We began ten years ago as No Pride in Prisons, a group concerned about the treatment of transgender people in prisons. We've since become People Against Prisons Aotearoa, a group dedicated to ending the caging of all people. We run the largest prisoner pen pal network in the world, advocate for thousands of prisoners, and are the most radical voice on prisons in Aotearoa.

Prison abolition means believing that a better world is possible when we work together. The government's plans to build megaprisons and ban puberty blockers can't stop us. This Pride, we're celebrating our queer origins and fighting for a queer future.

Village Collective

Established in 1997, Village Collective serves to empower young Pasifika people and their families with knowledge and resources to make well informed decisions about their health and wellbeing. Village collective through its educational programmes and community youth activation offers Pasifika Youth the skills and resources necessary to assist them to navigate life's challenges with confidence.

Village Collective is made up of three key Fales: Community Fale, Talavou Fale, and Rainbow Fale. Each Fale serves a unique purpose. Community Fale strengthens community connections and fosters youth development in leadership, the Talavou Fale supports the growth of Pasifika youth through school and community-based programmes. The Rainbow Fale provides equitable and innovative services that are culturally responsive to MVPFAFF+/LGBTQ+ young people and their families. Together, these Fales provide a holistic strengths-based approach to supporting Pasifika youth and families.

Rainbow Fale supports young Rainbow individuals through a variety of services offered throughout the year, including Diversity in-school groups, Mafutaga, Legends Leadership Group, TEU Wardrobe, Umata Network, LANU, and new projects currently in development for 2025. These initiatives are designed to provide safe, inclusive spaces for young people from the MVPFAFF+/LGBTQ+ community, offering them the opportunity to connect with like-minded peers and build supportive networks. While our origins are in Sexual and Reproductive Health, we've expanded to address broader social determinants of health, including mental health, healthy relationships, leadership, and mentoring. By supporting these areas, we aim to nurture resilient, well-rounded individuals who are empowered to thrive and make positive decisions for their future.
